- Gradual difficulty increase: Starting from slower, clearer audio sources and progressing to more complex authentic materials.

Numerous studies confirm the positive impact of authentic materials on listening comprehension. Researchers note that authentic input significantly improves learners' ability to recognize natural speech features and enhances their long-term listening retention.
